

# VISIT THE ICE AGE

## As You Explore Indiana Caverns

Approximately 40,000 years ago during the last Ice Age, many animals (including Flat-headed peccaries, Pleistocene black bears, bison, fishers, porcupine, owls, snakes and others) entered what today is Indiana Caverns. After the Ice Age entrance closed, 12,000+ years ago, the cave remained untouched until 2010.

Explorers discovered thousands of bones exposed on the cave surface that have been preserved by unchanging conditions for millennia. The significance of these fossils, which include not only bones but bear beds, claw marks and rare peccary tracks, has been verified by paleontologists.

You will see these long hidden relics on your tour. The first scientific excavation, lead by staff from the Indiana State Museum, took place in October 2014.

Indiana Caverns is conveniently located just outside historic Corydon, IN, 5 minutes off I-64. Just 25 minutes west of Louisville, KY

### DIRECTIONS:

- From **64** at Corydon take **EXIT 105** SR 135 south
- Turn South on **135** go 4.7 miles to Shiloh Rd
- Turn right on Shiloh Rd for .6 miles
- Turn right on Green Acres Dr for .2 miles to Indiana Caverns
